THIS IS WHAT WE'VE ALL BEEN WAITING FOR: ANNUAL CERTIFICATIONS

It's the most wonderful time of the year, and we aren't talking about the holidays or a relaxing beach vacation. It's Annual Certification time!

While we've all been here before, there are a few things to keep in mind when preparing to enroll for FY23 to ensure the smoothest transition possible: 1. Ensure the Program Contact listed in the

- FY22 Application Packet is current and accurate to not miss any important emails sent from the State agency. 2. Check to make sure your FY22 Application Packet is current and in approved status prior to
- enrolling in FY23. 3. Make sure your organization's CACFP team is aware of what's coming up and available to assist in
- the FY23 Annual Certification Preparation. 4. Have as much of the documentation ready to go ahead of time as possible.

Additional emails from the State agency will be headed in your direction for more specific guidance, but a great starting point in preparing is to look back over the previous year's guidance and training. While Annual Certification seems to be new and catches us all by surprise when it rolls around (it's not just sponsors, us at the State agency too!), the core components of annual certification remain the same. Components such as the budget section of the annual certification seem to be a rough spot for some. Remember that each organization is required to submit an annual budget of projected costs to administer and operate the CACFP for your organization. Has your financial team reviewed previous year's expenses and budgeted out anticipated costs yet? Is the documentation used to make these determinations accessible and ready to incorporate as supporting documentation for your budget? What about a budget narrative to demonstrate the anticipated use of allocated costs?




